Blue Valley Community Action Partnership assisted nearly **9,000** people by offering life-changing services that provide solutions to help build lives of stability, dignity and prosperity.

641 community volunteers | **45** foster grandparents

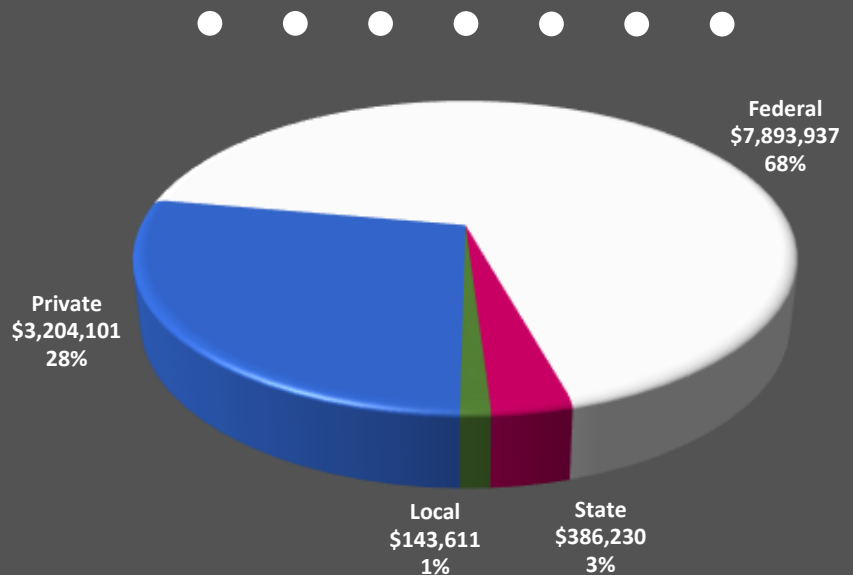
Community Volunteer donated **43,431** hours that were valued at **\$624,598**.

human resources

211 individuals were employed by BVCA.

39% of persons accepting employment offers with BVCA were unemployed at the time.

1,075 applications for employment were received.

106 employees are utilizing BVCA's retirement plan to save for their futures.

89 staff obtained or maintained certifications or professional credentials.

7,264 training hours were completed by staff to enhance their abilities to provide poverty-fighting solutions.

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
