Blue Valley Community Action Partnership assisted **6,840** people by offering life-changing services that provide solutions to help build lives of stability, dignity and prosperity.

**2,843** children | **2,866** individuals | **1,131** elderly

## *housing*

**362** households obtained safe, affordable housing.

**2,073** individuals maintained independent living.

**804** elderly | **1,075** disabled | **194** chronic illness

**44** homes were weatherized, preserved and/or otherwise improved.

**34** Weatherization | **10** Owner Occupied Rehab

**157** households obtained safe, temporary housing, which was 81% of those enrolled.

**198** households avoided eviction or foreclosure, which was 89% of those enrolled.

**148** individuals were provided Housing Counseling, which includes homebuyer education and case management.

## *health & well being*

**3,349** individuals demonstrated improved health and well being.

**3,045** physical health | **304** mental and behavioral health

**1,776** children obtained age-appropriate immunizations, medical and dental care.

**512** Immunization | **891** WIC | **373** Head Start

**4,903** people received nutritious food.

**3,425** Food Distribution | **1,195** WIC | **283** Head Start

## *asset building & jobs*

**251** people increased their financial knowledge and skills.

**33** youth | **218** adults

**112** people increased their savings and assets.

**17** youth | **95** adults

**76** unemployed individuals obtained a job to improve employment skills or increase income, which is 73% of those enrolled.

**15** youth | **61** adults

## education & cognitive development

**280** children became school ready.

**381** children improved social and emotional skills.

**644** adults and children received educational case management in their homes.

**111** youth were enrolled in after school programs.

**588** families improved their family functioning skills.

**409** improved positive approaches toward learning.

**104** youth | **305** children age 0-5

## community building

**609** volunteers engaged in activities to support BVCA, themselves and the community.

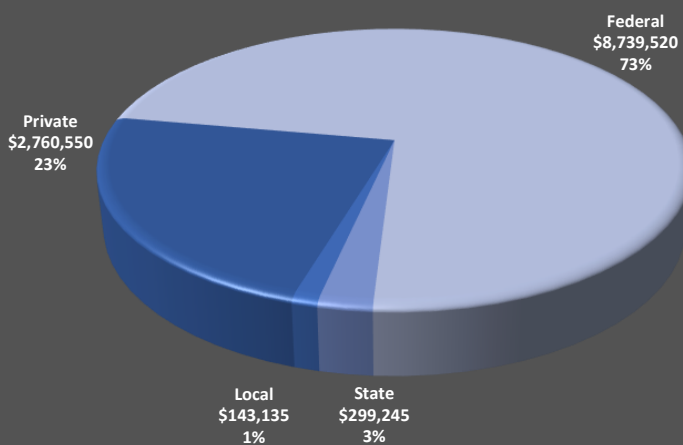
**567** community volunteers | **42** foster grandparents

**15** child care centers and their staff improved their quality of care by participating in professional development training and support provided by BVCA.

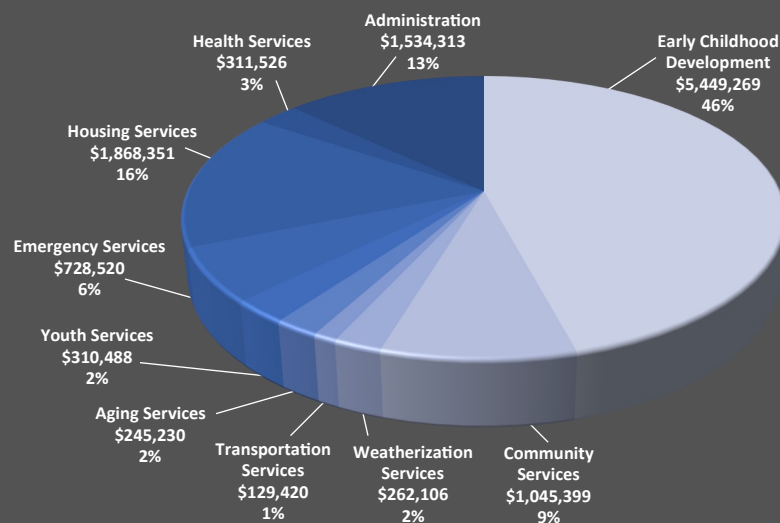
Community Volunteers donated **31,465** hours that were valued at **\$423,018**.

## funding & resources

**\$11,942,450** in funding was secured FY2020. For each of those dollars, \$.87 was used to meet the needs of BVCA's clients and mission.



**\$11,884,622** was expended to provide quality service in our communities.



## human resources

Benefit value per hour is **\$4.02**  
Includes health, vision, dental, retirement, life and the Employee Assistance Program (EAP).

**207** individuals were employed by BVCA.

**109** certifications or professional credentials were held by BVCA employees.

**5,612** training hours were completed by staff to enhance their abilities to provide poverty-fighting solutions.
