**362** households obtained safe, affordable housing.

**2,073** individuals maintained independent living. **804** elderly | **1,075** disabled | **194** chronic illness

44 homes were weatherized, preserved and/or otherwise improved.
34 Weatherization | 10 Owner Occupied Rehab

**157** households obtained safe, temporary housing, which was 81% of those enrolled.

**198** households avoided eviction or foreclosure, which was 89% of those enrolled.

**148** individuals were provided Housing Counseling, which includes homebuyer education and case management.

**644** adults and children received educational case management in their homes.


# community building

**111** youth were enrolled in after school programs.


