Blue Valley Community Action Partnership assisted **6,411** individuals by offering life-changing services that provide solutions to help build lives of stability, dignity and prosperity.

2,708 children | **2,826** adults | **877** elderly

housing

407 individuals obtained safe, affordable housing.

1,798 individuals maintained independent living.

641 elderly | **941** disabled | **216** chronic illness

86 individuals received services resulting in their home being weatherized, preserved and/or otherwise improved.

66 Weatherization | **18** Owner Occupied Rehab | **2** Purchase Rehab/Lease Purchase

292 individuals obtained safe, temporary housing, which was 99% of those enrolled.

327 individuals avoided eviction or foreclosure.

282 evictions prevented | **45** foreclosures prevented

170 individuals were provided Housing Counseling, which includes homebuyer, rental and mortgage education as well as case management.

health & well being

3,179 individuals demonstrated improved health and well being.

2,806 physical health | **373** mental and behavioral health

2,188 children obtained age-appropriate immunizations, medical and dental care.

617 Immunization | **1,228** WIC | **343** Head Start

3,635 people received nutritious food.

2,128 Food Distribution | **1,228** WIC | **279** Head Start

education & cognitive development

343 children became school ready.

406 children improved social and emotional skills.

605 adults and children received educational case management in their homes.

102 youth were enrolled in after school programs.

569 families improved their family functioning skills.

427 improved positive approaches toward learning.

97 youth | **330** children age 0-5

financial stability

233 people increased their financial knowledge and skills.
54 youth | **179** adults

107 people increased their savings and assets.
15 youth | **92** adults

87 unemployed individuals obtained a job to improve employment skills or increase income, which is 73% of those enrolled.
16 youth | **61** adults

community building

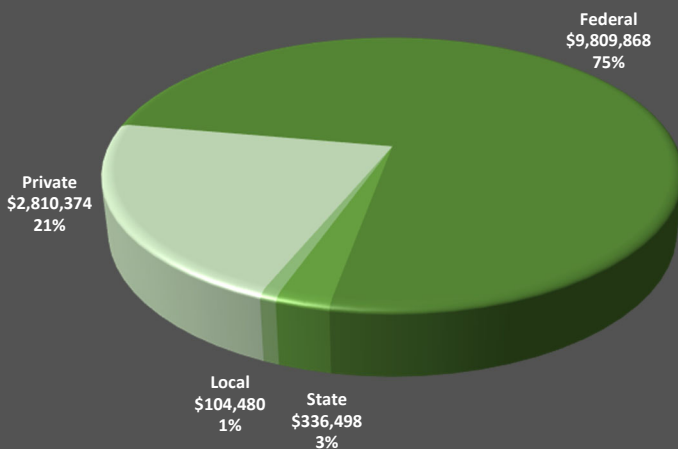
547 volunteers engaged in activities to support BVCA, themselves and the community.

13 child care centers and their staff improved their quality of care by participating in professional development training and support provided by BVCA.

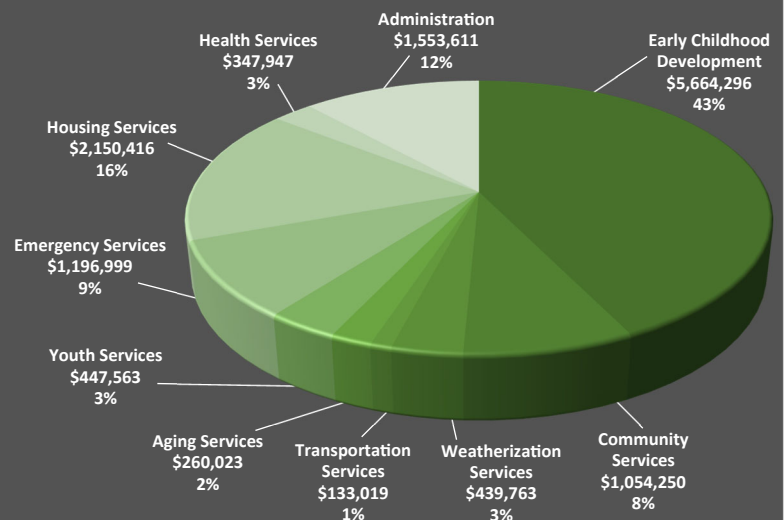
Volunteers donated **39,104** hours that were valued at **\$384,867**.

\$13,061,220 in funding was secured FY2021. For each of those dollars, \$.88 was used to meet the needs of BVCA's clients and mission.
