The Community Action Network is a robust state and local force that helps empower hardworking families to achieve economic independence rather than keeping them reliant on government assistance. There are nearly 1,000 agencies across the country working every day to create economic opportunity, strengthen local communities, and help families find pathways to prosperity. This year, Blue Valley Community Action Partnership, a proud member of the Community Action Network, commemorates 59 years helping families throughout Butler, Fillmore, Gage, Jefferson, Polk, Seward, Saline, Thayer and York Counties in Southeast Nebraska.

Each May, during Community Action Month, we reflect on the impact BVCA Partnership and our network has had on families. Last year alone, we served 8,060 throughout our service area, and over 15 million across the country with services that help families build skills to achieve long-term financial freedom. Community Action Agencies ensure that hard-working American families have access to the opportunities they need to thrive, while also promoting local economic growth and reducing government dependency. All agencies are locally controlled with boards of directors composed of local elected officials, private and public sector representatives, and engaged community residents. We are proud of our communities' participation in the development and oversight of our programs. Their engagement helps us to be more effective in our approach by determining what communities in southeast Nebraska needs.





our programs Housing Development: Construction of affordable rental housing units &/or lease-to-own units. Available: All BVCA Counties

Our service area includes Butler, Fillmore, Gage, Jefferson, Polk, Saline, Seward, Thayer and York Counties in Nebraska. Limited services are also provided in other counties. BVCA provides the following programs:

AmeriCorps Seniors Foster Grandparent Program: Provides opportunities for low-income persons, 55 years and older, to give supportive person-to-person service to help alleviate the physical, mental, or emotional problems of children having exceptional or special needs. Available: Fillmore, Gage, Johnson, Nemaha, Otoe, Pawnee, Richardson, Saline, Seward, d York Counties lefferson Thaver and York Counties

Blue River Early Learning Academy: High quality, early childhood education and care program for children six weeks through twelve years of age. Provides developmentally age appropriate educational activities in all care settings and nutritionally approved meals to all children in a licensed facility. Available:

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP): Government purchased dities are distributed to income eligible individuals age 60 and older to foster good health and nutrition. Available: All BVCA Counties

<u>Compassionate Projects</u>: Volunteers, community groups and local businesses donate time, materials, food, toys, skills and love which are used in a variety of seasonal holiday projects, especially at Christmas, benefiting low-income individuals and families. Available: All BVCA Counties

Early Head Start: A home-based program that provides pregnant women and children, birth to three, with family centered services and activities. Available: Fillmore, Gage, Jefferson, Saline, Thayer and York Counties

Early Head Start-Child Care Partnership: BVCA partners with child care providers who agree to meet the Head Start Program Standards which includes comprehensive and continuous services to low-income infants, toddlers and their families. The partnerships increase quality care and education to a center-based option while parents are working or going to school. Available: Jefferson and Saline Counties

<u>Emergency Assistance</u>: Individuals and families are assisted with small emergency requests such as transportation, car repairs, prescriptions, and various other small emergencies on a very minimal scale, depending on resources available at local level. Available: All BVCA Counties

mergency Solutions Program: Assists individuals and families who are literally komeless or imminently at risk of komelessness by providing housing relocation and stabilization services to help quickly regain stability in permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis. Available: All BVCA Counties

Focused Youth on Rehousing, Empowerment & Stability (FYRES): Works with youth who are homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless. Works together with youth to identify and obtain housing, work on retaining that housing, connect to supports and resources, & to address the issues which led them to the homeless situation. Available: All BVCA Counties

Food Security Programs: Individuals and families who are facing a shortage of food are assisted through the generosity of donations by individuals, communities, organizations and businesses. There are various options for securing food. Available: All BVCA Counties

Head Start: A nationally renowned child development program for preschool children ages 3 to 5, which stresses parent involvement, education, social services, and health. Available: Fillmore, Gage, Jefferson, Saline, Seward, Thayer and York Counties

Housing Counseling: Provides workshops, homebuyer education and one-on-one <u>rousing courseming</u>, roundes workshops, homeouver exocution and one-on-one counseling to help customers correct issues that prevent affordable mortgage financing, stable rental housing and foreclosure. BVCA's courselor will also provide assistance in debt-load management with the preparation of a monthly and manageable budget plan. Individuals enrolled in the program will agree e a 6-24 month commitment to get them "mortgage ready". Available: All

Housing Rentals: Affordable rental housing and lease-to-own properties available to income eligible families. Available: Butler, Fillmore, Gage, Jeffer Polk, Saline, Thayer and York

Infant/Toddler Quality Early Childhood Initiative Program: Provides profe development and support to home-based, center-based, and child care staff to improve quality care. Available: Gage, Jefferson and Saline Counties

Information and Referral Services: Local staff provide needed information regarding services, make appropriate referrals to community organizations, agencies and other resources, and complete follow-up services. Available: All BVCA Counties

<u>Owner-Occupied</u> Rehabilitation: Low income and moderate income homeowners are offered low-interest loans &/or forgivable loans to rehabilitat homes to meet health and asfety needs, limited by type or extent of work needed. Available: All BVCA Counties

<u>Rural Transportation</u>: County-wide transportation services within and out of the county are available for a small fee for general public. Available: Fillmore County

Scholarship Opportunities: As part of a competitive application process scholarships are available to income-eligible individuals planning to attend college. Scholarships can be used for tuition, books and fees associated with enrollment. Available: All BVCA Counties

SNAP Outreach: BVCA staff can assist applicants with the online Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) application. Available: All BVCA Counties

Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF): The goal of the SSVF is to promote housing stability among very low-income Veteran families who reside in or are transitioning to permanent housing. Through provision of outreach and case management, assistance is given to obtain VA benefits and other public benefits. Available: All BVAC countries as well as Caso, Otoe, Johnson, Nemaha, Pawnee, Richardson, Douglas, Sarpy in NE; and Pottawattamie, IA

Telehealth: Individuals can utilize BVCA Partnership's equipment and internet services to access their virtual medical and mental health appointments. If needed, BVCA's friendly staff can help set them up and get them connected, while still providing privacy for their appointments. Available: All BVCA Counties Thrift Stores: Community donations of clothing and household items are recycled and made available for a small handling fee. Used furniture is available in York. Available: Butler, Fillmore, Polk, Seward, Thayer and York Counties

Vaccines for Children & Private Vaccines (VFC): Vaccines are provided free by the Nebraska DHHS through BVCA's Immunization Program to uninsured infants 2 months or older, and children. Insured or private pay vaccine is also available, Available; Fillmore, Jefferson, Saline and Seward Counties

Weatherization: Provides no cost weatherization of homes to income eligible families. This may include: weather-stripping: patching damaged areas of homes: heating and cooling systems tuned and deaned or replacement; insulation of attics, walls and foundations; and windows and doors repaired or replaced. Available: All BVCA counties

Women, Infants & Children (WIC): A health and nutrition program for at-risk breastfeeding, pregnant and postpartum women, infants and children to age 5. After medical and nutritional screening, eWIC cards are given to certified individuals for food from local stores. Available: Butler, Fillmore, Polk, Saline, Seward and York Counties

WIC Peer Counseling Program: Provides education and support for pregnant sure a successful breast-feeding ex Available: Butler, Fillmore, Polk, Saline, Seward, and York Counties




Did staff members offer you additional information about other programs that might help you and your family?

How would you rate staff members' knowledge of BVCA Partnership's programs and services?




